Last week David Deffenbaugh shared this true and motivational story on Facebook...

My friend Taylor Cave preaches for the South Walker church of Christ on the south side of Oklahoma City. He's a former missionary to Brazil and this congregation made the decision a few years ago to change their approach. Their numbers had been dwindling for several years as the demographics of that part of the city transitioned to primarily Hispanic. They decided to make a determined effort to reach their neighbors (Hispanics), though they were unlike the average member of that congregation (older Caucasians). It was a decidedly bold and courageous (and very kingdom-driven) decision. It has been a real joy and inspiration to watch how God has blessed this church as they have determined to do what God calls all His children to do.

Taylor often posts about the many good things that are going on in that community through that church. Today he shared the good news of a new disciple of Jesus Christ having been immersed into Christ. That's not an unusual kind of a post for him, but he also shared how this particular soul was reached with the gospel. Some time ago (not sure how long) a lady from the community attended an event hosted at their building. She was invited to come to worship. She came. Some time after she invited one of her daughters to come. She came. Some time after that, that daughter invited her sister to come. She came. That daughter then invited a young man to come. He came. He's since been attending worship and also youth Bible classes and participated in personal Bible studies. He heard the gospel and was saved by Jesus. He represents a fourth generation of invitations. That church hosted a community event (not even an "evangelistic" event) and an invitation was extended. That invitation ended up going through three more people and a young man heard the gospel and was saved.

Not everyone is an evangelist. Not everyone is gifted to teach. Not everyone sees themselves as "evangelistic." But everyone can invite and every church can serve their neighbors. And just because we don't see immediate results, it doesn't mean God is not very much at work through our (sometimes feeble and faulting) efforts.

Galatians 6:10 charges us, "So then, as we have opportunity, let us do good to everyone, and especially to those who are of the household of faith." God opens doors for us to do good every day; we only need eyes to see and the will to enter them. And there's lots more that we could plan and do together to help people.

The aim is not just to help people, but to point them to Jesus who helps us. Every Sunday and Wednesday provide occasions for people to hear about Jesus when we come together. Can we be more committed to inviting people? And what about offering people personal Bible studies? I would love to help you study with someone you know. Let's do our best for the Lord this year. He promises to keep helping us if we will do his work.

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to observe all that I have commanded you. And behold, I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matt. 28:19-20).
