One day, when we're in Heaven, we will be so happy we chose to be faithful to the Lord. We will be so thankful we arrived at this eternal destination, as we realize it is beyond anything we might have ever imagined.

In fact, the reason we don't live out our lives more zealously for the sake of Heaven is because our mortal minds can't fully appreciate how wonderful it will be. If we could, we would be laser-focused on bringing it to fruition with everything we do.

This past weekend, one of the speakers at the Challenge Youth Conference in Dallas was Reed Swindle, who is scheduled to be at Hillcrest for a gospel meeting in the fall of 2026. God wants us to be in Heaven SO MUCH. We know the passages: Romans 5:8, "but God shows his love for us in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us." John 3:16, "For God so loved the world, that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life."

What will make Heaven so great? For starters, being with Him who saves us forever, 1 Thess. 4:17. Sure, we have the symbolic description of Heaven's beauty from Revelation 21, and earlier in the same chapter we're told there'll be no death, no sorrow, no more crying. We have passages that give us hope of recognizing and enjoying our loved ones who have gone on before us (2 Sam. 12:23, Luke 16:23). Heaven will be far beyond anything I can describe, and I'm thankful for the insights God gave us in His Word.

All I know is one day, when you're in Heaven, you'll be so happy you chose to serve the Lord... unless you're not. If you're not happy on that day, you won't be in Heaven.

Remember, God wants you to be in Heaven even more than you want to be there, and that's only because you can't possibly know that complete joy yet. You can't truly want what you can't fully know.

I pray that we all know Heaven one day.
