In 2013, a Harvard student named Eva Shang penned a piece titled “You Do Not Have to Be a Leader” for the university’s student-run newspaper. She wrote, “You do not have to be a leader to matter. If you are truly passionate about making a difference, perhaps it is time to let go of the delusion that you must be a leader. Perhaps it is time to learn the value of following.”

Throughout his ministry, Jesus Christ taught the value of following! As Jesus proclaimed the gospel throughout Galilee, he felt compassion for the crowds because they were “harassed and helpless, like sheep without a shepherd” (Matthew 9:36). Without a shepherd to follow, we are lost and vulnerable to the enemy.

Numerous times throughout the gospels, Jesus called others – “Follow me!”

Jesus described himself as a leader in this way: “I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep... My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me. I give them eternal life, and they will never perish, and no one will snatch them out of my hand” (John 10:11, 27-28).

Eva Shang recognized that too many people want to be leaders and not enough people want to be followers. Why is leadership often more desirable to us than followership? Peter, a shepherd in the early church, knew the answer.

In 1 Peter chapter five verse four, Peter reminds his fellow shepherds that even they follow the chief Shepherd. In the very next verse, Peter commands Christians to follow the church leaders and be clothed with humility. Humility is required to be a follower! Peter recognized that pride can tempt us to desire leadership in ways that are self-serving.

Leaders matter. The Good Shepherd laid down his life for us, “and we out to lay down our lives for the brothers” (1 John 3:16). Jesus Christ is our example of leadership.

Followers matter, and we are all followers of the Good Shepherd. Don’t let pride hold you back from being a follower. Know that you can make a difference as a sheep, and you are well cared for by the Shepherd.
